B. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Consult *Manual*. Paragraph 427. "General Guidelines for Preparation for Christian Ministry".

Courses

There are four general courses administered by the Board of Ministerial Studies: Ministerial leading to Elder; Christian education Compassionate Ministries, and Music Ministries leading to Deacon. These may not be ordained without having completed their respective course of study.

Annual renewal of the Commission as a Minister of Music is subject either to having completed the course in the Deacon Track or showing evidence of pursuing it.

Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts college and if possible the Nazarene Seminary. Other modes are the Nazarene Bible College, Carolinas School of Ministry (in alliance with Nazarene Bible College). And the Modular Course of Study. The Modular Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the district board.

General curriculum areas for ministerial preparation are in MANUAL section 426.3. Modular Study courses are in the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development*.

Modular Study Regulations

1. Each candidate is instructed to purchase the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development* in order to become familiar with the details of the entire program.
2. All course work and examination should be completed and credited by May 15 in order to apply to current assembly year. Work filed thereafter will be applied to the following year.
3. CLT courses are permitted aids to study, but not a means of passing courses.
4. Candidates should be prepared to appear for interview as called upon by the Boards of Ministerial Studies.

College Students

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary evidence of academic standing in harmony with MANUAL section 426. At graduation, the final transcript will be evaluated by the District Board of Ministerial Studies, and no requirements stated in the MANUAL will be waved.

FIRST DAY

District Assembly Rally Service
Monday, July 25, 2011, 7:00 p.m.

Rev. Ken and Rev. Mary Paynter, Clemson – the Bridge pastors, delivered their fourth pastors’ report. Rev. Bill Higgins, Honea Path Genesis pastor, presented his second pastor’s report.

An offering was received for SC District Compassionate Ministries. The “Celebration of Baptism” video was played during the offering. Following the video, the District Praise Team sang “The Comforter Has Come.”

General Superintendent Jesse Middendorf began his sermon by reviewing the core values of the Church of the Nazarene. We are Christian; we are Missional; we are Holiness. After highlighting the core values, Dr. Middendorf asked the congregation to turn to Acts 1:1-11 and pointed out that we can live the Kingdom life in a broken world only through the power of the Holy Spirit.

We need the power of the Holy Spirit to 1) break our stubborn will; 2) deal with incredible losses and adversities; 3) love our enemies and deal with broken relationships; and 4) win the world. Apart from the Holy Spirit, we cannot do anything. When He comes, He is enough. We need to be sure to invite Him to our next gathering at our churches. Dr. Middendorf closed his message in prayer. After announcements, Dr. Estep dismissed the congregation.

69th SC District Assembly

Tuesday Morning, July 26, 2011

The morning session of the 69th South Carolina District Assembly began at 8:30 a.m. with Mike McAdory playing “My Tribute” accompanied by Brian Watts. Mike led the congregation in singing the “New Doxology.”

Dr. Robert Broadbooks, USA/Canada Regional Director, brought greetings and led the congregation in prayer. Dr. Eddie Estep welcomed Dr. and Mrs. Jesse Middendorf.

Dr. Middendorf brought a devotional message and challenged and encouraged everyone to follow God's plan.

District Secretary, Rev. Greg Pressley, made the following recommendations for the organization of the Assembly: That the recording secretary be Joy Klotzle and election secretary be Eddie Felder. Pages were Rev. Bill Watts, Rev. David Snodgrass, and Rev. Brandon Watts. Rev. Pressley then called Board of Tellers Nos. 1 and 2 and recommended that the voting area be the main floor of the sanctuary, mezzanine, sound booth, and district office. Times of services were set for Monday evening at 7 p.m. and Tuesday 8:30–Noon, 2 p.m.–adjournment, and 7 p.m. for ordination service. Special orders of the day included the District Superintendent's report at 10 a.m., university report at 11 a.m., memorial service at 11:50 a.m., and ordination service at 7 p.m.

Special greetings will be sent to our missionaries; to the widow of former district superintendent, Mrs. D. W. Thaxton; to retired district superintendent emeriti, Dr. and Mrs. James Bearden and Drs. Moody and Nina Gunter. Greetings will also be sent to Holland and Betty Webb of the Greenville First church who are serving in Guatemala. By common consent these recommendations were approved.

A motion was made and seconded to seat the alternates and accept the organization of the assembly. The recommendation was adopted by the delegation.

Motion was made and seconded to accept Partial Report No. 1 of the Ministerial Credentials Board. Motion passed.

Dr. Estep presented new pastors and spouses to the assembly.

Dr. Middendorf presented Dr. Edward L. Estep for his fifth District Superintendent's report. Dr. Estep presented this year's "Top Ten" list of highlights. Then he took a look at our progress toward our three district goals. 1) Foster a Hunger for God; 2) Facilitate Leadership Development; and 3) Further Fruitfulness. Report was received with a standing ovation and motion was made and seconded to adopt the report. Motion passed.

Rev. Richard Coleman, secretary of the District Advisory Board, presented Diane Estep with a bouquet of flowers. He then expressed appreciation and presented a gift to Dr. Estep. The Esteps thanked the district and expressed their love.

Dr. Middendorf drew attention to the Committee on Nominations, Partial Report Nos. 1, 2, and 3. A motion was made to adopt the report, seconded, and the report was adopted.

Board of Tellers No. 1 was called to distribute Official Ballot #1 for District Advisory Board, Ministerial Credentials Board, and Trustee to Trevecca. The District Advisory Board ministerial nominees were Chuck Fountain, Rodney Lindsay, Ben LaPlace, and Harry Varn. DAB layperson nominees were Richard Davis, Ron Howard, Paul Hines, and Ken McDougall. Ministerial Credentials Board nominees were Tim Haynes, Ben LaPlace, Kyle Poole, Glenn Sherman, Brent

Walker, Matt Johnson, Ray Moore, Alan Pullen, and JimThrower. Trustee to Trevecca nominees were Brad Bellomy, Karen Lawson, and Mike McAdory. Once voting was finished, the ballots were collected and counted.

Board of Tellers No. 2 was called to distribute Official Ballot #2 for District Court of Appeals – Ministers and Laypersons, and Ministerial Studies Board. This was a yes/no ballot. Nominees for District Court of Appeals were ministers – John Sanders and Jesse Sims; laypersons – Ray Jensen and Vicky Ostendorf. Ministerial Studies Board nominees were Bob Albert, Jerry Branham, Cheryl Kammermann, Karen Lawson, Rodney Lindsay, Glen Link, Harry Varn, and Billy Williams. Ballots were collected and both Boards of Tellers were dismissed to count the ballots.

Pastors' reports began with NewStarts: Ben LaPlace, Aiken Ebenezer; Georgetown; West Columbia Hispanic has a report on file. Honea Path Genesis and Clemson – the Bridge reported on Monday evening. Upstate pastoral reports were given as follows: Matt Johnson, Greenwood Community; Tim Haynes, Spartanburg First; Bill Segur, Simpsonville LifeSpring Community; Chuck Fountain, Greenville First; Tommy Baltzegar, Seneca; Alan Harkey, Duncan LifeSpring Community; and Jerry Springfield, Laurens Cornerstone. Cherrydale Hispanic has a report on file. After a video from NPH, pastors' reports continued with the Santee area as follows: John Griggs, Conway; Maurice Wells, Sumter Celebration; T. W. Mitchell (report #62), Ashwood; Brent Walker, Myrtle Beach – The Connection; Karen Lawson, Florence Family Life; Arthur Sharpe, Sumter Calvary; Dale Turner, Manning NewStart Community; Sammy Geddings, Sumter Wise Drive; and Greg Pressley, Sumter First.

Dr. Dan Boone, president of Trevecca Nazarene University, presented the college report and brought greetings from TNU and highlighted developments on campus. The District Distinguished Alumni Award from Trevecca was presented to Peggy Smith. A book and CD gift was presented to each pastor, and everyone joined in singing the Trevecca Hymn.

Dr. Middendorf drew attention to Ministerial Credentials Board Partial Report No. 2 and Partial Report No. 3. Motion was made and edited to add Jim Stocks to District Interim Assignment on Partial Report No. 3; motion was seconded and passed as edited.

The Piedmont area was called for pastors' reports as follows; John Porter, Chester; Dan Swan, Rock Hill Grace; Ron Fite, Rock Hill First; Rick Morris, Rock Hill Emmanuel; Jerry Branham, Lancaster SonLight Community; Aubrey Smith, Fort Mill; and Steven Torman, York. Reports are on file for pastors of Clover, Rock Hill Celebration, and Rock Hill Trinity.

The District Secretary read the results of Official Ballot #1 as follows: total ballots – 281. For District Advisory Board, Chuck Fountain received 211 votes, Rodney Lindsay 169 votes, Ben LaPlace 83 votes, and Harry Varn 82. Chuck Fountain and Rodney Lindsay were declared elected. For DAB laypersons, Richard Davis received 146 votes, Ron Howard 148 votes, Paul Hines 99 votes, and Ken McDougall 149 votes. Ron Howard and Ken McDougall were declared elected. For

Ministerial Credentials Board, Tim Haynes received 123 votes, Ben LaPlace 75, Kyle Poole 124, Glenn Sherman 44, Brent Walker 133, Matt Johnson 160, Ray Moore 139, Alan Pullen 133, and Jim Thrower 172. Matt Johnson, Ray Moore, and Jim Thrower were declared elected. There will be a run-off between Brent Walker and Alan Pullen for the fourth position on this board. For Trustee to Trevecca, Bran Bellomy received 67 votes, Karen Lawson 94, and Mike McAdory 118. Mike McAdory was declared elected.

Official Ballot #2 results were read as follows: 276 ballots were cast. For District Court of Appeals ministers, John Sanders received 257 yes and 5 no votes; Jesse Sims 246 yes and 4 no. John Sanders and Jesse Sims were declared elected. For District Court of Appeals laypersons, Ray Jensen received 250 yes and 10 no votes; Vicky Ostendorf 246 yes and 6 no. Ray Jensen and Vicky Ostendorf were declared elected. For Ministerial Studies Board, Bob Albert received 250 yes and 17 no votes; Jerry Branham 260 yes and 8 no; Cheryl Kammermann 251 yes and 11 no; Karen Lawson 263 yes and 8 no; Rodney Lindsay 256 yes and 11 no; Glen Link 254 yes and 11 no; Harry Varn 254 yes and 13 no; and Billy Williams 261 yes and 7 no. Since this was a yes/no ballot, all on this ballot were declared elected.

Board of Tellers No. 1 was called to distribute the tie-breaker ballot. Ballots were cast and collected, and tellers were dismissed to count those ballots. The Memoirs report was presented. Names scrolled on the screen as the men's trio sang "One Day." Motion was made and seconded to adopt this report, and Dr. Estep led in prayer for the families and friends of each person on the list. The report was adopted.

Dr. Middendorf and District Secretary Pressley made announcements and dismissed everyone for the lunch break until 2 p.m.

Tuesday Afternoon, July 26, 2011

Brian Watts opened the afternoon session leading the congregation in "Amazing Grace (My Chains are Gone)." Rev. Carey Pratt led the congregation in prayer.

A Pensions and Benefits video was presented after Dr. Middendorf explained the impact of financial pressures on the World Evangelism Fund as a result of economic circumstances. Retired ministers were asked to stand and were assured that Pension and Benefits would be there for them as the new pension plan is phased in.

The results of the run-off election for Ministerial Credentials Board were read by District Secretary Pressley. There were 270 ballots cast; Alan Pullen received 117 votes and Brent Walker received 153. Brent Walker was declared elected to the Ministerial Credentials Board.

Pastors of the Pee Dee area were called to report: Myra Harding, Hartsville Calvary; Bobby Norris, Wallace. Dr. Estep presented the Nazarene Bible College Alumnus of the Year Award to Rev. Norris. Reports continued with Carey Pratt, Hartsville First; Tony Lupton, Georgetown NewStart; Scott Crandall, Lugoff Faith;

Garry Lee, Bishopville; and Mark Foster, Bennettsville First. Report is on file for Pageland Rose Memorial, and Camden currently has no pastor.

Pastors' reports continued with David Spires, Cayce; Alan Pullen, Columbia Abundant Life Fellowship; Jim Thrower, West Columbia Central; Brian Walker, Columbia Grace; Harry Varn, Winnsboro; Bill Harmon, West Columbia First; and Richard Coleman, Lexington Shepherd. Report is on file from Columbia First pastor, Paul Johnson, who is currently in school completing a master's degree.

Due to earlier technical difficulties, the Pensions and Benefits video was presented again in completion. Dr. Estep pointed out the benefits of P&B and to the necessity of giving faithfully to this area.

Dr. Middendorf drew attention to the District Advisory Board report. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to adopt this report. Attention was drawn to the Ministerial Studies Board report. Motion was made, seconded, and report was adopted. Four students have completed the course of study – Brent Erb, Harold Miller, David Snodgrass, and Bill Wojtkowski. Camp Development/Operations Board report was adopted by motion, second, and unanimous vote. The South Carolina District Hispanic Ministries report was presented, and motion was made, seconded, and voted to adopt.

LaNora Jensen presented highlights of the District Treasurer's Report. Motion was made to adopt the treasurer's report; report was adopted with a unanimous vote and words of appreciation.

Bill Harmon presented the District Finance Committee report and pointed out changes that have been made. A correction was made on page C-9 to delete Conway's \$2400 making the total Missional Growth Ministry Investments \$72,500. Motion was made and seconded to adopt this report. After some explanation of World Evangelism Fund and Fair Share Percentages chart for this year and history of fluctuation in Fair Share percentages, everyone was assured that the percentage would be lower if/when possible. A question was raised as to why the percentage is being increased when the district completed the year in the black. Significant cuts have already been made in the district operations. Churches were encouraged to participate as much as possible in reaching the goals. Motion was made and seconded that a written ballot be used to vote on this report; vote was divided on this motion. Dr. Middendorf ruled that a paper ballot would be used. Board of Tellers No. 1 was called to distribute the ballot as to whether to approve this report. Votes were cast and collected, and tellers were dismissed to count the votes.

The Nazarene Foundation video was presented. This foundation works with people to help them invest their estate/resources in God's kingdom. Following the video, the following pastors from the Lower Midlands area began reporting: Bill Watts, Pelion; Thom Harvey, New Ellenton New Life; Will Harvey, Orangeburg First; Billy Williams, Orangeburg Memorial; and Kyle Poole, Midland Valley First. Reports are on file for Bamberg and Batesburg pastors.

Pastors from the Low Country area were called to present their reports: Ted Hambrick, Beaufort New Direction Community; Gary L. Rupert, Walterboro First; Rodney Lindsay, Charleston Calvary; Allan Rashford, Charleston St. Andrews;

Jason Leviner, Moncks Corner; Elwood Stith, Charleston Cross Community interim pastor; and Michael Blankenship, Summerville.

Report was presented on the written ballot about adoption of the District Finance Committee report. There were 251 votes cast; 179 yes votes and 72 no. Report was adopted as presented.

Bill Ulmet, tenured evangelist, gave a report on behalf of the evangelists. Dr. Middendorf encouraged calling of evangelists.

Larry Wagner gave a report on the Carolinas School of Ministry. Alumnus of the Year award was given to Jerry Branham. Distinguished Service Award was presented to Milton Harrington for his years of teaching at Carolinas School of Ministry. Michael Johnson announced an upcoming golf tournament to raise scholarship funds for TNU. Attention was called to the Nixon Endowment Scholarship Award.

Auditing review was done. Motion was made and seconded to accept this review, and it was adopted.

Announcements and thanks were given to all who helped with the Assembly.

Motion was made and seconded to allow the District Secretary to edit and harmonize the minutes. Motion passed. Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the District Assembly at the closing of the ordination service this evening. Motion passed. Bill Ulmet was asked to pray the closing prayer.

Ordination Service

Tuesday, July 26, 2011, 7:00 p.m.

Dr. Eddie Estep welcomed everyone to the District Assembly Ordination Service, made announcements, and read scripture from Acts 13:3.

Processional: As the congregation sang "Holiness Unto the Lord," the three retiring elders and spouses and the ordinand and spouse were led into the sanctuary.

Statement of Purpose and Invocation: Dr. Jesse Middendorf explained that the purpose of the ordination service is to celebrate the call of God on the lives of men and women to preach the gospel and to devote themselves full-time to the service of Christ and His Church in behalf of the kingdom of God. He explained that the service was both a time of sacredness and celebration. Dr. Middendorf then led the congregation in prayer.

Scripture Reading: Rev. Billy Williams, secretary of the Ministerial Studies Board, read Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-16.

Dr. Estep led the congregation in reading The Apostles' Creed.

Recognition of Retiring Ministers: Rev. and Mrs. Bob Albert, Rev. and Mrs. George Gardner, and Rev. and Mrs. Dennis Johnson were called to the platform. Dr. Estep read biographical information on each retiree. They were granted the status of retired assigned elders in the Church of the Nazarene. Dr. Middendorf presented a plaque from the Board of General Superintendents to each of them.

Challenge to Newly-Licensed Ministers: Dr. Eddie Estep read the names of those receiving a District Minister's License for the first time [Terry Bennett,

Patricia Davis, Brent Erb, John Frierson, Fred (Wallace) Hammond, Tony Lupton, Gabriel Moreno, Richard E. Morris, Elaine Sebyt, Steven Torman, Dana Wolfe] and asked the newly licensed ministers and their spouses to stand. He charged each one to keep a guard upon his own soul by maintaining a daily devotional life and walk with the Spirit. He reminded each to minister first to his or her own spouse and children, to support their local church and pastor, and to preach and teach the Word, to be faithful stewards of time, talents, and resources, and to be faithful to do the things needed for ordination. He asked the newly licensed ministers if they would covenant with the Assembly to accept this charge and if so to say “I will.” Dr. Estep then prayed for the newly licensed ministers. Following the prayer, he asked them to join their fellow ministers in the choir.

Presentation of the Ordinand: Rev. Greg Pressley presented the ordinand Jeremy Marquis Veal.

Receiving of the Ordinand: Dr. Jesse Middendorf received Jeremy Marquis Veal for ordination. He then explained what it meant to be ordained.

Examination of the Ordinand: Dr. Middendorf directed several questions to the congregation and then asked the ordinand some questions and asked him to respond.

The Ministers’ Choir, led by Dennis Pinnell, sang “Hear the Call of the Kingdom.”

Three young people in the Readers’ Theater read paragraphs 401-401.5 from the *Manual*. These paragraphs outline the qualifications for ministers.

Following the reading, Mike McAdory, Tim Godby, and Dennis Pinnell sang “I Then Shall Live.”

Dr. Middendorf began his message by reading from 2 Timothy 4:1-8 where Paul is writing from prison and had reached the place in his life that he could trust God in whatever circumstances came his way. He is writing admonitions to Timothy, his son in the faith. (1) Proclaim the message – it is a life-transforming message that is the hope of the world. (2) Do the work of an evangelist – hard work and necessity for every minister and layperson. (3) Endure hardship/suffering/affliction – face reality of spiritual warfare as you plead for others. (4) Carry out ministry fully – it is a lifetime commitment. When you reach retirement, you may lay down some responsibilities, but you will continue to serve as an elder. He concluded by asking the elders present if they would accept the ordinand and received a positive response.

Ordination Ritual: Dr. Middendorf asked the District Secretary, Greg Pressley, to bring the ordinand and wife to the platform. He then asked for the ordinand’s family and local church people to stand in support. All ordained ministers were invited to come behind the candidate for the laying on of hands. Dr. Middendorf delivered the charge to Jeremy Marquis Veal. The prayer of consecration was offered by Dr. Dan Boone. Following the prayer, Dr. Middendorf presented the ordinand with his certificate of ordination. Dr. Boone presented him with a sculpture from TNU entitled “The Calling.” The congregation was invited to

a reception following the service honoring the three retiring elders and the district's newest elder.

Following a prayer of benediction, the service concluded with the song "A Charge to Keep I Have."

V. Reports

A. DISTRICT OFFICERS

1. District Superintendent

General Superintendent Dr. Jesse Middendorf, Trevecca Nazarene University President Dr. Dan Boone, USA/Canada Regional Director Dr. Bob Broadbooks, fellow ministers, delegates, and friends of this assembly: With joy and a grateful heart I welcome you to this 69th annual assembly of the South Carolina District Church of the Nazarene. It is a privilege for me to present this fifth annual report.

With Paul I say, "I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and his incomparably great power for us who believe" (Ephesians 1:16-19).

TOP TEN

This year's "Top Ten" list highlights some of the many ways the Lord has blessed the district since our last assembly.

10. Camp Dining Hall Groundbreaking: This ceremony was held April 5, 2011. We have now completed Stage 1, and all work completed to this point has been done with cash on hand from many generous donors. Richard Coleman is providing excellent leadership in this project.

9. 2011 Ministry Team Retreat: This year's retreat had a larger attendance than any retreat in the last ten years. I want to thank the District Advisory Board for encouraging a weekend retreat, enabling bi-vocational pastors as well as pastors' spouses who work outside the home to attend. I also want to thank church boards for investing in their pastors and spouses and for recognizing the importance of the fellowship, encouragement, and inspiration this event provides.

8. Successful Local Church Building Programs: Cayce finished their new Community Outreach Center. The fellowship hall, which will seat 160, was completed debt free. Charleston Calvary dedicated their new Family Life Center on June 12, 2011. Chester has finished their Family Life Center and is enjoying this new ministry venue. Rock Hill Trinity enjoyed the first Sunday in their beautiful new facility on April 3, 2011. Dedication is set for September 11, 2011.

7. God's Creative Generosity: Early in the church year it became apparent that the reduction in the district budget percentage adopted by the 2010 District Assembly would result in a significant district deficit. The district did what many local

churches found it necessary to do – evaluate priorities, reduce expenses, and maximize missional impact. Significant adjustments to salaries and programs were strategically implemented and gracefully accepted. As our faithful pastors and committed District Ministry Team were responding to the challenge with faith and a Christlike attitude, God began to show His “Creative Generosity.” Three of our churches received generous grants from the Cannon Charitable Trust for facility improvements. A church received the donation of adjacent property. Another church remembered the district assistance they had received during a difficult time a couple of years ago, and returned the blessing by sending the district an unexpected check for \$4,000. Two of our churches, after paying their own budgets in full, helped three other churches pay their district budgets. The camp benefited from the receipt of a life gift annuity. These are only a few of the ways God showed His “Creative Generosity.” Our resources have been stretched, but so has our faith. By God’s grace the district, all departments, and the camp ended the year in the black despite having received \$100,000 less in Fair Share contributions than anticipated.

6. 2011 Camp Meeting. Camp meeting continues to be an opportunity for the district family to come together for a week-long spiritual emphasis, strongly enhancing the “connections” between our people and churches across the district. We experienced inspiring worship with Greg and Geri Rosser and TNU’s EverPraise, great preaching by Susie Shellenberger and Nelson Perdue, and many victories around the altar.

5. Marriage Matters: Diane, following her passion for marriage and family, hosted pastors and spouses from all seven of our Mission Areas for “Marriage Matters” dinners in our home. Over 70 pastors and spouses attended. This year she will be hosting full-time pastoral staff and their spouses for “Marriage Matters.”

4. Notable Fruitfulness: The following churches experienced growth in both attendance and membership, including significant growth in at least one area in addition to fulfilling all denominational allocations: Aiken “Ebenezer” (Pastor Ben LaPlace), Clemson “The Bridge” (Pastors Ken and Mary Paynter), Conway (Pastor John Griggs), Florence Family Life (Pastor Karen Lawson), Greenville First (Pastor Chuck Fountain), Hartsville First (Pastor Carey Pratt), Midland Valley First (Pastor Kyle Poole), Moncks Corner (Pastor Jason Leviner), Myrtle Beach “The Connection” (Pastor Brent Walker), New Ellenton New Life (Pastor Thom Harvey), Rock Hill Trinity (Pastor Phil Jones), Simpsonville LifeSpring (Pastor Bill Segur), Sumter Wise Drive (Pastor Sammy Geddings), West Columbia Central (Pastor Jim Thrower), and Wallace (Pastor Bobby Norris).

3. Honea Path “Genesis” Church of the Nazarene was officially organized on Palm Sunday, April 17, 2011. Pastor Bill Higgins received 19 charter members into the fellowship of the new church.

2. Clemson “The Bridge” Church of the Nazarene was officially organized on April 3, 2011. Pastors Ken and Mary Paynter received 12 charter members into the fellowship of this new church.

1. South Carolina District / South America Region Partnership: The reported population of South Carolina has increased 15.3% in the last decade, from 4,012,012 to 4,625,364. During the same period our Hispanic population has increased 153.9%, from 92,878 to 235,632. God is helping us address this growing mission field. Through the leadership of our Hispanic Ministries Director, Javes Munoz, we have formed a partnership with Nazarene Theological Seminary in Quito, Ecuador, to train Hispanic men and women in South Carolina who have been called to the ministry. Presently, there are 34 of our Hispanic brothers and sisters in the course of study. We now have Hispanic ministry taking place in 7 locations. We have the potential for Hispanic ministry in 65 locations – in every local church in South Carolina.

Let’s look at the progress made toward our three district goals.

Our strong desire is to see a sanctified passion for God in each individual and church on the South Carolina District and a move of the Holy Spirit in each local church.

The District Awakening Tour, with Dan and Chad Bohi, was attended by approximately 750 South Carolina Nazarenes, including almost all of our pastors. As a result, many are even hungrier to see an authentic move of God in the churches on the South Carolina District.

The D. Moody Gunter Camp and Retreat Center continues to be an important tool for fostering a hunger for God. Only eternity will reveal the lives impacted there in just the last year. Camp meeting, two youth camps, three children’s camps, a Pastors’ Prayer Summit, four Hispanic Encounter weekends (with 200 conversions), and numerous retreats have provided opportunity for significant spiritual development. We will continue to build on these opportunities.

We have implemented an intentional prayer emphasis preceding district events, promoted Prayer Rooms at camp meeting and district assembly, and continued the Pastors’ Prayer Summits.

This year we encourage our pastors and churches to foster a hunger for God by:

- Preaching and teaching entire sanctification

- Designing and implementing a prayer and fasting strategy in each local church
- Challenging each member to daily Bible reading and prayer, and regular fasting
- Scheduling at least one spiritual renewal/revival-type series of meetings

Goal #2: Facilitate Leadership Development

We desire to have pastors who think missionally, understand strategies for effective change, equip local leaders, and have the relational skills to lead congregations through times of change. We intend to raise up leaders who model Christlike discipleship and godly service and who in turn invest in the development of other leaders.



Leadership Development

Much progress has been made in this area.

Six of our pastors completed the Pastoral Leadership Development program this year: Sammy Geddings (Sumter Wise Drive), Bill Harmon (West Columbia First), Thom Harvey (New Ellenton), Bill Higgins (Honea Path Genesis NewStart), Kyle Poole (Midland Valley), and Harry Varn (Winnsboro). This investment in pastors may be the most important thing I do.

Thirty-four Hispanics have begun the course of study for ministry at Greenville First.

The enrollment in the Carolinas School of Ministry has increased significantly to 56 under the direction of Dr. Larry Wagner.

District assembly workshops offered by Dr. Mark Lail, Director of Stewardship Ministries, and Dr. Roberto Hodgson, Hispanic Coordinator USA/Canada, provided resources for our leaders in the areas of stewardship and multi-ethnic outreach.

This year we will transition from an interview-based credentialing process to an assessment-based process for individuals who are testifying to a call to ministry. Pastor Chuck Fountain is leading this effort.

Eurasia Regional Director, Dr. Gustavo Crocker, will lead a Leadership Development training day for pastors, "Leading Churches for Missional Engagement," on Tuesday, August 30, 2011.



Fruitfulness

Goal #3: Further Fruitfulness

We desire to see an increase of healthy, growing disciples and healthy, growing churches.

We concluded the church year with 10,003 members (-24); 353 new Nazarenes (-175); 6,469 worshippers each week (-69); 5,037 in Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries each week (-55); and \$9,834,300 total church income (-\$230,235). There were 1,005 conversions

(+167) and 218 baptisms (-21) in our churches. We were able to organize 2 new churches this year (+1)—Honea Path “Genesis” and Clemson “The Bridge”—and ended the year with 62 organized churches (+1) and 3 NewStarts (-3). Our NewStart churches are progressing toward organization. It is time to give renewed attention to additional NewStarts. May God call more men and women to the exciting and challenging opportunity of starting a new work in South Carolina!

It appears that we have lost some of the significant gains in attendance and membership made last year. We can do better in all of these areas of fruitfulness. Lost souls are at stake. The expectation is that each church and each pastor will be fruitful.

Our financial commitment to others improved significantly this year, and the percentage paid toward denominational investments increased in every area. World Evangelism Fund: \$537,839 (109%); Trevecca Nazarene University: \$182,751 (81%); Pensions & Benefits: \$156,992 (87%); and District Fair Share: \$522,386 (96%).

GRATITUDE

Thanks be to God for His saving, sanctifying, and sustaining grace. He has blessed us beyond measure. I am grateful for the pastors and laity of our district and for their commitment, sacrifice, and fruitfulness. Our District Advisory Board and Mission Area Directors continue to serve with distinction. Special thanks to District Secretary Greg Pressley, District Treasurer LaNora Jensen, and District Finance Committee Chairman Bill Harmon for their service throughout the year. Department leaders LaNora Jensen (NMI), Jim Thrower (SDMI), and Mike O’Hair (NYI) have provided strong leadership. In the district office, Peggy Smith and Rachael Watts continue to endear themselves to South Carolina Nazarenes through their servant’s hearts and notable abilities. I am especially blessed by Diane’s partnership in life and ministry.

The district mourns the passing of retired pastors Rev. Sidney Murphy, Rev. Hubert Richardson, Rev. William Carter, and Rev. Warren Holloway. The passing of Rev. Ed Kessler—a young, active pastor—was a significant loss to the district. I was so proud of the way you supported the Kessler family. Our pastors filled up one-third of Charleston Cross Community Church for Pastor Ed’s memorial service. Our churches gave generous love offerings to his family. We saw our connectionalism at its best.

Rev. Dennis Johnson is retiring after ten years of exemplary service at the D. Moody Gunter Camp and Retreat Center. We are so very appreciative of his ministry, and we have every confidence that Rev. Alan Pullen, who will become camp manager on August 1, will be able to continue the excellent leadership Dennis has provided.

CHALLENGE

South Carolina District family, we have worked hard together during this past year to advance the cause of Jesus across this great district, from the Low Country to the Midlands to the Upstate, and there is much work still to be done. We must evidence an urgency to see the lost saved and the saved disciplined. We are engaged in a majestic effort and our calling is nothing less than to be used of God to see transformed lives, families, neighborhoods, and communities across South Carolina. May God equip us, empower us, and enable us to see it happen!

Our mission is clear: “Making Christlike Disciples in the Nations.” The report before you today is the combined report of Nazarenes from all over South Carolina in doing just that. You will notice that I did not say the report of churches, SDMI Chairpersons, or of pastors. The reason for this is simple. The accomplishing of this mission is the responsibility of “all of us.” This is “our report.”

A little later today we will have the opportunity to hear from our District Adult and Children’s Ministry Directors and even “see” a little video of some events that were held this past year. I am proud to say that under the leadership of Rev. Bill Watts in Adult Ministries, and Rev. Dana Bays in Children’s Ministries, South Carolina SDMI has once again provided a number of wonderful opportunities for people, young and old, to “Make the Connection” to Jesus Christ.

As a District I want you to know that we are blessed to have a truly gifted and caring SDMI Council and the consistent support and encouragement of our District Superintendent, Dr. Eddie Estep. My personal appreciation of and for them continues to grow as we serve together.

“Our” Statistical Report

We all know that statistics never tell the “whole story” about how we arrived at our end of the year numbers, but they do help us to assess the effectiveness of our stewardship of what has been entrusted to us.

Our total SDMI Attendance for 2010-2011 was 5,037, a decrease of 70 from 2009-10 and our Responsibility List Total for 2010-2011 was 9,841, a decrease of 4323 from last year.

While I have experienced a real sense of discomfort over our decreases in both attendance and Responsibility List, I am thankful to be able to report to you today that 30 churches showed an increase in their SDMI attendance over last year and 23 churches showed an increase in their Responsibility List totals.

I emphasized at last year's convention the importance of understanding the role (no pun intended) of our Responsibility Lists and want to restate again today how important it is for us to seek "intentionally" to see individuals and families added this year. In SDMI we are in the business of helping folks "make the connection" to Jesus Christ and the more who are on our Responsibility Lists, the more we have the opportunity to share Jesus with.

"Our" Awards

Last year I challenged us to see 25 churches achieve Award Status. I am pleased to report today that 23 of our churches did. As your names are called, would the Pastor and SDMI Chairperson of each church come forward and receive your certificate.

As a District SDMI Family, we celebrate with you the increases you have seen and pray that God will grant you even greater gains for His Kingdom in the new year!

With a number of additional churches coming very close to achieving Award Status this year, I am confident that we can see at least 30 churches reach that goal next year.

“Our” Challenge for the New Year

In Discipleship Ministry we are compelled by Christ’s Commission to “make disciples in all the nations” and yet live fully aware that this is not something that can be accomplished in our own strength. The work of spiritual transformation is the work of God. Our privilege, as those whom He has redeemed, is to point others to the Him as the only One who can meet their heart’s true needs, and once they have been transformed by His grace, to aid them in maturing in His Likeness.

As we approach a new year I invite you to consider with me three elements that I believe are essential to our effectiveness in ushering people into a life transforming relationship with Jesus Christ and beyond.

1. First, we must be “intentional” about making disciples.

Being “intentional” suggests that we no longer hold to the status-quo concerning our preparation for discipleship ministry. To become “intentional” means that our ministries will be determined more by how we can reach the lost and disciple new believers than continuing to “do what we have always done.” New attention to curriculum, class times, new class formats, and new days for discipleship ministry offer new opportunities that we must take advantage of if we are to reach our world today.

It means that we, as Discipleship Ministry Leaders, will work “intentionally” and creatively to offer spiritual opportunities and curriculums that will call unbelievers to faith in Christ and believers to a lifestyle of Christian Holiness.

Becoming “intentional” means that we will assess ourselves concerning whether we are seeing our students find out personally...

A. What is a disciple?

B. How they can become a disciple of Jesus Christ?

C. What being a disciple means after Jesus becomes your Savior?

D. What are some areas where they should grow in spiritually after they have accepted Jesus as Savior?

E. What are some steps they will need to follow to ensure that they “grow in grace”?

F. What role does accountability to one another play in discipleship?

Ken Hemphill in his book, Revitalizing the Sunday Morning Dinosaur, says that the beginning of the demise in Sunday School “can be traced to a time when denominations and local churches failed to use Sunday School with evangelistic intentionality and purpose.” When the design was forgotten the Sunday School became a maintenance tool rather than a growth tool.

Sunday School and Discipleship Ministry has always held as its purpose bringing people to the knowledge Christ and helping them grow strong in Him. It is time “intentionally” for us to do it again!

2. We must be “passionate” in our presentation of the gospel.

What doesn't impassion us will surely not impassion others! To First Century Christians discipleship was important because it was costly! It was not something they could treat casually and be done in their spare time. They knew that it called for complete surrender and passionate following. Radical obedience to the call and commands of Jesus was their identification as His followers.

A cynical and skeptical world looking on today calls for us to answer this question: "Will they see being lived out in us a passion about and for what it is that we say they desperately need?" I heard it taught once (in talking about the impact of spiritual leaders upon their congregations) that a congregation will hardly ever "surpass its spiritual leaders in their devotion to God." As SDMI leaders we cannot afford to be casual in our service. Whatever we do in service to the Lord must be done with our "whole hearts." We must be examples of what "hearts on fire for God" look like!

The early Christian Church evidenced something within that literally "compelled" them to obey God and to serve their fellow man. Their calling was to something larger than themselves. It appeared to all that "they no longer lived for themselves, but for Him who died for them and was raised again."- (2 Cor. 5:15)

Given the great privilege of sharing the "Good News" of Jesus Christ with our classes and small groups demands that we be prayerfully prepared and passionate in our presentation of it as well.

We leave here to go back into a world that needs to see the expression of just such a passion in our personal lives, our Sunday Schools and Discipleship Ministries. With God's help they will!

3. Finally, we must be "faithful" as examples of what discipleship looks like to those we are entrusted to teach.

Faithfulness is defined by words such as trustworthiness, reliability, and dependability. It speaks of one who can be counted on. When it comes to influencing others for Jesus I don't know of any virtue more important. Our faithfulness to Him is what gives credibility to our declaration that He is Lord.

As SDMI leaders we understand our calling to impact our world for Christ. Three areas especially require our faithfulness if we would influence others for Him:

We must be a people faithful to obey His Word. Scripture cannot be something we occasionally consult but must be the prism through which we view and interpret our place in the world. The Bible will always remain our guide for spiritual truth. We must be faithful to be a people of prayer. Our personal communion with God is what enables us to speak intimately of the God whom we serve. Personal prayer and praying for your class members will make a difference in how we both teach and model discipleship. We must be a people faithful to His Bride, the Church. Ephesians 5 tells us that Christ is coming again one day for His bride and He is preparing her for that day. We who call Him Lord are that bride. The

better we become at discipling the next generation of believers, the better His Bride will reflect His desires for a needy world.

As we begin a new year full of challenges and opportunities let's remember that faithfulness is God's measurement for true success.

At the end of the day what God looks for in each of us is the simple obedience of a servant's heart to do His will. I am convinced that it is out of the faithful service of His people that God ultimately advances His Kingdom.

3. District NMI President

Dr. Jesse Middendorf, Dr. Eddie Estep, Michael and Tamara Hudson, members of the Council, Pastors, Presidents, delegates and friends of this 69th Convention of the South Carolina District Nazarene Missions International, I bring to you my seventh report.

Nazarene Missions International has four objectives: praying, discipling, giving, and educating. South Carolina, you have been faithful at working on these objectives.

1. Praying

South Carolina, we are a praying district. We have participated in World Day of Prayer, Nazarene World Week of Prayer, the Persecuted Church, for those in the 10/40 window, and the JESUS Film. We are praying for the requests on the Prayer Mobilization Line. We have prayed for our LINKS families, , and especially our retired missionaries, one of whom went home to heaven in June. You have prayed and supported our South Carolina missionaries, , Work and Witness Coordinators at Southern Africa Nazarene University, and NCM Coordinators for Southeast Asia. Thank you for your faithfulness in praying.

2. Discipling

South Carolina, you have been faithful in mentoring and involving all people including youth and children to make Christlike disciples in the nations. In October we held our annual Children's Mission Fair at the D. Moody Gunter Camp and Retreat Center with 270 children and adults in attendance. One hundred twenty crisis care boxes and school pal paks were brought to the camp. The total deputation offering was \$750.

When Jimmy and Brenda began preparing to go to Swaziland, we started receiving calls and e-mails to inquire when South Carolina would take a Work and Witness team to Swaziland. People were waiting so they could be the first to

complete an application. Let me take just a moment to tell you about two students who were a part of this team. Cayce Yarbrough heard Jimmy and Brenda's story. God began to talk with Cayce and impress upon her to go to Swaziland. She had a desire to go and minister to the children who were orphans. Another young lady, Margaret McCoy, had heard the mission stories. She too felt a pull on her heart that she needed to go. South Carolina, because you are discipling and mentoring youth and children, they are going on Work & Witness trips, they are allowing God to use them. We cannot let up. We must continue to tell the mission stories. We must disciple and mentor people.

3. Giving

This year you gave \$43,520.40 to Alabaster.

We were blessed by missionaries, Beverly Gruver, Wellington and Hellen Obotte, George and Nancy Miller, and Michael and Julie Shalley. \$17,818.60 was given for deputation.

One hundred sixteen names were placed on the Memorial Roll. Thirty- four people were awarded a Distinguished Service Award. Many of our churches sent an offering for the Missionary Health Care. A total of \$12,701.43 was given to the Missionary Health Care.

We gave \$6,812.50 to LINKS and \$3,913.36 to World Mission Broadcast. \$59,474 was given for Compassionate Ministries.

This year we had a different format for giving to the World Evangelism Fund. I spent most of the year wondering where we stood on this giving. I was encouraged from your calls and e-mails when you shared great things concerning your giving. Well, the numbers are finally in and South Carolina, you gave \$537,839 to the World Evangelism Fund. We are 109% this year.

Forty-six of our churches overpaid their World Evangelism Fund. We have 39 churches earning the Church of Excellence this year by paying at least 5.7 percent for the World Evangelism Fund.

4. Educating: informing people of the world's needs and enabling our church to meet those needs in Christ.

You have used mission publications, read mission books, participated in mission service projects, and attended a service with a mission speaker. South Carolina read 5,921 missionary books this year.

I have a wonderful NMI team and I want to say thank you to them (please stand as I call your name) – Dr. Eddie Estep, Pastor Carey Pratt, Sue Powell, Elizabeth Dunham, Kathryn Culp, Libby Newman, Nancy Hicks, Pastor Karen Lawson, Richard Davis, Bill Haynes, Mike O’Hair, Sylvia Whiting, Pastor Richard Coleman, Connie Hoover, Pastor Brian Walker, Terri Snipes, Marsha Fountain, Joan Webb, Rachael Watts, and Whitney Lyman.

Before I close my report, I must share some of the ways South Carolina congregations have supported the Great Commission and Nazarene missions in an extraordinary way.

Cayce – Reaching out to the people in their community with free meals and Bible Study.

Columbia First – Participating in an all-church missions project with over 200 volunteers; special offering for those affected by the earthquake in Japan.

Lugoff Faith – Praying for all the countries around the world.

Moncks Corner – Serving 30-35 families by having a food bank.

Orangeburg Memorial – 15 boxes of crisis care kits; rolled and sent 810 bandages to the hospital in Papua New Guinea; raised \$2200 for bicycles for Pastors/Missionaries (the children raised over \$700 of this).

Sumter First – Weekly worship service at a park where homeless gather, provide meals and clothing for homeless/indigent people.

Greenville First – Sending two couples to serve as volunteers and a special lady, Ruth, making 500 quilts for the children in Swaziland.

Wallace – Children used the quarter’s folders to raise \$90 for the WEF plus offering.

As I close my report, I want to give a big thanks to my husband Ray, my local church at Pelion, and Pastor Bill Watts for your help, prayers, and support.

It is a joy to pray, disciple, give, and educate people about missions. I ask each of you to keep missions alive in your church. Time is short and we must not fail to win the lost.

Director's Report
School Year 2010-2011

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord.

It is with great joy that I bring this report of the Carolinas School of Ministry to this district assembly. We have had an exciting year with new students, new faculty and new procedures.

We had 24 students enrolled in the fall semester and 21 in the spring. These are both increases over the previous year's enrollment. We had 6 students take their first class from us in the fall and 2 more in the spring. This summer's registration is ongoing at the time this report is being written but it appears that we will have an increase in enrollment for this semester as well.

Two new faculty members have applied to teach with us, one from each district that we serve. One has been approved to join our faculty and the other one is in the process of getting the paperwork done. While gains are nice, we also received word that one of our faculty members, Scott Roberts, will no longer be with us as he has decided to move to "Hurricane Alley" and will no longer be a part of our district.

We held our first faculty retreat at the D. Moody Gunter Camp and Retreat Center on March 4-5, 2010. Seven faculty members participated in a discussion of *The Seven Laws of the Learner* in an effort to better improve our abilities to train the future ministers of the district.

Another highlight of the year was the beginning of a scholarship program. The Carolinas School of Ministry Board approved this program and several of the board members' churches have already helped with gifts of \$100, giving us a start of \$500. We have also received specified scholarships in the amount of \$1160 which were designated for specific students. We invite all the alumni of our program to share in this effort. Will you ask your church to take an offering for the Carolinas School of Ministry Scholarship Fund? Two students have already benefited from this fund.

Carolinas School of Ministry is moving forward in its efforts to be available for all those who are called to preach but cannot move to Trevecca or Nazarene Bible College. Is someone in your church experiencing a call to ministry? We invite you to send them to us as a call to preach is a call to prepare.

Thank you for the opportunity to minister in this capacity for another year.

5. Camp Development/Operations Board

We, your Camp Board, submit the following report:

1. The D. Moody Gunter Camp & Retreat Center sponsored 67 day and 113 overnight events this year with a total of 14, 474 guests, an increase of 459. We were pleased to host 10 Carolinas School of Ministry classes along with one Faculty Retreat. We host the District Children's Bible Quiz, Children's Mission Fair, Prime Time, Pastors' Prayer Summits, Youth and Children Camps, Family Camp, and we provide pastors a room without cost for rest, restoration, and preparation. We also promote Camp Work Days where Nazarenes from across the state and beyond come to invest themselves in the ministry of the camp through "sweat equity." We continue to look for opportunities to invest in the ministry efforts of the South Carolina District. While our goal is to invest in South Carolina Nazarenes at every opportunity, we also welcome the opportunity to provide our facility to as many other ministry groups as possible.
2. Family Camp was wonderful. Nearly all private and district housing units and RV sites were filled all week again this year. Outstanding music provided by Rev. Greg and Dr. Geri Rosser assisted by EverPraise of Trevecca Nazarene University set the worship tone. Powerful messages from the ministry team of Dr. Nelson Perdue and Rev. Susie Shellenberger inspired all. Morning devotions led by various pastors and a Pastors' Seminar on "Formational Worship" led by Rev. Greg Rosser were well attended. The District IMPACT Team presented a mini concert on Youth Night. Biker Night was high-lighted by Biker Ministry opportunities. A reception honoring retiring camp manager Dennis Johnson with "gifts-a-plenty" was given following lunch on Sunday afternoon and a Singspiration service concluded the week of blessings. Total weekly attendance was 5484. The expense offering total was \$24,000. Received on New Dining Hall, \$11,206.43.
3. Jr. and Sr. High camps were held separately this year with 241 in attendance. Both camps participated in a missions trip to repair, restore, and refresh a former school building in Saluda, South Carolina, that is now a community center.
4. Attendance at the children's camps is projected to reach 230. The South Carolina District is blessed to have such excellent and dedicated leadership in both the youth and children's departments.

As this report is being written, the contractor is pouring the floor for the new dining hall. "IT IS HAPPENING" – Praise God! Thanks to the continued investments of South Carolina Nazarenes and many others, the ministry of your camp continues to increase. We invite our churches and other groups to use the camp as we partner

together in ministry.

For the coming year we have a change in the position of camp manager. We want to thank Dennis for his leadership and diligence for the camp. As we look forward to Alan Pullen continuing in his place, we are excited because God has not changed nor has His mission for the D. Moody Gunter Camp and Retreat Center.

6. South Carolina District Hispanic Ministries Report

I praise the Lord for a year of work in which we have been able to advance with the Hispanic Ministry in the South Carolina District. This year we have achieved significant progress in the starting of new churches in West Columbia, Greenwood, Spartanburg, and Midland Valley, as well as we established a church in the Perry Correctional Center in Pelzer, South Carolina.

We had four Spiritual Retreats, "Encounter with God," through the year—one every three months at the D. Moody Gunter Camp and Retreat Center as a strategy to gain and encourage new believers. A total of 200 people between the new churches and the Greenville Hispanic congregation participated and accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior. As of today, we are still working with them in the discipleship process.

On the other hand, we have obtained the approval of an agreement with the South American Nazarene Theological Seminary in Quito, Ecuador, to prepare Spanish-speaking ministers to lead and work in outreaching the Hispanic population in South Carolina. At the present moment we have 34 students officially enrolled in the seminary.

Finally, I want to thank District Superintendent Dr. Eddie Estep, our Senior Pastor of the First Church of the Nazarene in Greenville, Rev. Chuck Fountain, and other pastors for their support and for believing in the existence of a missionary need in the Hispanic population in the South Carolina District. I pray the Almighty God to open doors to further advance in the process of establishing Hispanic churches in South Carolina.

Furthermore, we are dependent upon the integrity of pastors and local church financial officers in developing and maintaining a means to this ministry that is equitable and healthy.

We recommend the following:

1. That for the **2011-12** fiscal year local churches participate in the Fair Share Plan (FSP). The FSP shall be conducted in this manner: each local church shall contribute seven percent of its weekly tithes and offerings (including its Sunday School offering) for the support of the following South Carolina District Ministries: District Operations, District Missional Growth, Camp, District Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries, District NYI, District NMI. 6. That the District NYI, District Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries, District NMI councils provide monthly treasurer reports to the District Superintendent.

7. That the District SDMI, NMI, NYI, Missional Growth, and Camp councils/boards present a proposed annual budget to the District Finance Committee.

8. That the district treasurer and all department treasurers be bonded at district expense.

9. That all district salaries and benefits and general assembly delegate allocations be preferred claims; and that all other district expense not specified, including office equipment, be paid as ordered by the Advisory Board; that travel expense for the district board and committee meetings be set at one half of the current IRS standards.

10. That each auxiliary department pays the following amounts to the district treasurer for:

10. We recommend that each church receive copies of the district assembly journal, and that the district secretary take orders during the district assembly for as many additional copies of the journal any church shall desire at \$6 each. The district secretary shall order as many additional copies as deemed necessary on the church's behalf.

11. That the district superintendent be given 5 weeks vacation with pay.

12. That the local church be responsible for the pastor's and any associate pastors' health insurance premiums.

13. That all district treasurers' books be audited by a qualified accountant.

14. For South Carolina Nazarene churches that have paid their Education Budget, TNU will match 2-to-1 any amount the local church sends in for their students up to a \$500 check. So a student may receive up to \$500 from the local church and TNU will add up to \$1,000 to make it up to a \$1,500 Church Match Scholarship.

15. For South Carolina Nazarene churches that have not paid their Education Budget, TNU will match 1-to-1 any amount the local church sends in for their students up to a \$500 check. So a student may receive up to \$500 from the local church and TNU will add up to \$500 to make it up to a \$1,000 Church Match Scholarship.

Guidelines for Local Church Boards

1. That church boards assume responsibility to see that seven percent of the local church's offering is sent to the District Treasurer each week.

2. That our churches and departments have their treasurer's books audited at the end of the statistical church year preferably by a qualified accountant, or by a competent committee, and that a letter is sent to the district office verifying this audit. This is to be verified on the annual pastor's report.

3. That all church records are filed at the end of each statistical church year under the supervision of the church board, and that confidentiality be properly maintained.

4. That the district superintendent may meet with the local church board on his visit and review the pastor's salary and compensation.

5. That our churches pay full-time evangelists approximately twice their pastor's salary. Travel expenses and Social Security taxes should be in addition to the compensation provided.

6. That our people be encouraged to exercise the stewardship of possessions and annuities and life loans in behalf of the church. We further recommend that the pastors use every means to conduct an active bequest program through the local congregation.

7. That each church observe Nazarene Bible College Day on Sunday, October 2, 2011, and Nazarene Theological Seminary Day on Sunday, January 29, 2012, by distributing publicity materials and receiving an offering.

Pastoral Care

Care for our pastors is a biblical concept and practice that needs to be carefully considered by our church boards. Realizing that staffing and financing resources of the churches can vary, we urge the appropriate committees to study and recommend action annually in each of the areas below. Churches receiving district support must comply with existing district policy regarding local church finance.

A. Salaries

1. Each church, where appropriate and possible, should endeavor to employ its pastor on a full-time basis.

2. The pastor's and paid associate pastors' salaries are to be carefully reviewed annually as a minimum. It should be recognized that a salary increase is not an actual increase unless it is above the current cost-of-living index. When a pastor leads a church in growth that is reflected in increased finances, let this be a factor in determining the amount of increase in his/her salary and benefits.

3. A study should be made of the pastor's and associates' compensation to determine means of limiting tax liability. Professional assistance is available through the office of Pensions and Benefits. We recommend local churches seek assistance relating to the tax laws and their impact on tax liability of pastors and associates.

4. The pastor's and associates' salaries are to be considered a preferred claim.

5. That the pastor and associates be given at least one week's salary as a Christmas gift.

B. Housing

1. In housing matters, churches should carefully consider the options of the pastor purchasing his own home versus retaining a church-owned parsonage to best meet the pastor's need.

2. When a pastor or associate purchases his own home, a housing allowance should be established commensurate with current housing and utility costs, in line with current IRS standards and consistent with P&B church newsletters.

3. If a parsonage is owned by the local church, the appropriate committee or board should be aware of and responsible for needed repairs and maintenance.

C. Insurance

1. Church boards should work with pastors to obtain optimum insurance coverage.

2. For churches that are financially able, we urge each local church to provide at least a \$1,500 medical reimbursement account for the pastor and full-time associates for the purpose of covering out-of-pocket medical expenses not covered by our insurance carrier.

3. Consideration should be given to provide the supplemental term life insurance and the long-term disability insurance for the pastor and associates that is offered by the general church.

4. At the point of hiring, that the local church be responsible for the pastor's and any associates' insurance premium.

D. Local Church Expense

1. The church should provide a pastor's auto expense reimbursement, continually considering the increase in church-related auto costs. Consideration

should be given to operating costs, maintenance, depreciation, insurance, and registration. Some churches may choose to provide a car for their pastor.

1. Each church should make provisions for a comfortable and well-equipped office for its pastors. This provision should include supplies, postage, telephone, and secretarial help when needed.

2. Recognizing that entertainment is a local church expense, consideration should be given to establishing an expense account to reimburse pastors for expenses incurred in professional responsibilities.

3. Each church should assist their pastor(s) with Work & Witness trip expenses, whenever possible. These ministry experiences should not be considered as vacation.

E. Retirement Benefits

1. The church should reimburse the pastor the full amount of Social Security tax based on the total of his/her salary and housing allowance or parsonage rental value (where possible, including utilities).

2. The local church should give consideration to establishing a matching TSA (tax sheltered annuity) plan for the pastor through the TSA programs offered by the general church or other such programs. We encourage each local church to match up to 3% of the local pastor's contribution to a retirement plan through the TSA program chosen.

3. The local church should remit their P&B payment in order for the pastor to receive retirement benefits.

Well Being

A. Physical

1. The pastor and full-time staff should be given an annual paid vacation. As a guideline, we suggest the following schedule for total years of service, not just the tenure of service at the current assignment:

0-4 years	2 weeks (including 2 Sundays)
5-14 years	3 weeks (including 3 Sundays)
15-24 years	4 weeks (including 4 Sundays)
25 or more years	5 weeks (including 5 Sundays)

2. The pastor is urged to take at least one day each week for relaxation and refreshment of the mind, soul, and body. Since this is not always possible, we recommend that pastors be given compensating days off and that the local church insist on days off.

B. Spiritual

1. Realizing that pastors face stress, pressure, and exhaustion, consideration should be given to granting extended time away (week or month) for rest, renewal, prayer, and spiritual growth.

- a. The pastor should have completed a reasonable period of service in the current assignment.
- b. For those with less tenure, consideration may be given to granting extra days away for rest, renewal, and study.
- c. After 7 years in a local church, we recommend a paid sabbatical leave of not less than one month (not vacation time) for rest, renewal, prayer, and spiritual deepening, with district leadership approval.

2. We urge that members of the local church uphold their pastors daily in prayer.

C. Educational

That each church encourage all of its pastoral staff to enrich their ministry at the local church by providing funds and time for continuing education as outlined in the most recent Church of the Nazarene *Manual* paragraphs. This may include ministerial conventions, seminars, directed studies, and special college and seminary courses. This provision may also include the purchase of professional development materials (books and periodical allowances) and the payment of professional dues.

D. Inspirational

That each local church assist their pastor and associates in attending district assembly, Family Camp Meeting, conventions, and the annual retreat for pastors and their spouses and that these meetings not be considered vacations.

Family

Special Recognition

1. Each church is encouraged to recognize all members of the parsonage families at appropriate times of the year: Pastor Appreciation Month, birthdays, anniversaries, Christmas, etc. Special attempts should be made to show appreciation and express love to the pastors and families at all times.

2. That our churches remember the retired ministers, missionaries, and evangelists within their membership with special acts of love and kindness.

VI. Minutes of the Conventions and Auxiliaries

A. DISTRICT SDMI CONVENTION

Monday, July 25, 2011

The South Carolina Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries Convention convened on Monday, July 25, 2011, at 1:15 p.m. at First Church of the Nazarene in Columbia, South Carolina.

Stefanie Fuller led the delegation in praise and worship, “Because We Believe.”

Dr. Jim Thrower welcomed the delegates and made announcements highlighting reports and advertising ideas. He noted that workshops would be available that afternoon. He also reported that a check was received from the Ladies’ Retreat to be used in Children’s Ministries.

Dr. Thrower continued with an announcement regarding the Mid-Year Rally to be held in January 2012 with guest speaker, Pastor Kerry Willis.

Secretary, Rev. Brenda Turner, set the order of the day, established the voting bar, and called the Board of Tellers. She named Eddie Felder as chairman. The Board of Tellers was as follows: Lisa Jeffcoat, Vickie Jones, Bill Dixon, Ann Cockrell, Joy Klotzle, Jonathan Brock, Lewis Ray, David Deese, Lisha Segur, and Nell McGee.

Dr. Jim Thrower read both ballots and made a motion to adopt both ballots. The motion was seconded and unanimously carried. The ballots were distributed.

Dr. Eddie Estep addressed the convention and announced the specific workshops that would be available that afternoon. He then presented Dr. Jim Thrower to give the Chairman’s Report for South Carolina Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International.

Dr. Thrower delivered his report to the convention. He praised the efforts of the Mid-Year Rally. He said that our mission is clear: “Making Christlike Disciples” – and that responsibility falls on all of us, not just pastors and teachers.

B. DISTRICT NYI CONVENTION

Monday, July 25, 2011

The Impact team welcomed delegates to the convention with worship.

NYI Convention was called to order at 9:18 p.m.

NYI President, Mike O'Hair, welcomed everyone to NYI 2011, opened in prayer and went over the materials provided in the packets, including a cd that contains all forms for every district event as well as posters for three events.

NYI Secretary, Lori Martz, introduced the platform staff and called the pages to the front: Emily Kelly, Rachel Harmon, Laurabeth Winchester. She also made a note about the pages procedure. Lori set the bar at the first 6 rows across the entire sanctuary.

Mike introduced NYI Treasurer, Donna Hines. Mike made mention that Donna would be resigning as Treasurer. Mike turned the floor over to Donna.

Mike reported on Youth Camp and shared reports sent via text to his phone by the students. Mike thanked Ellen Broome for her help at camp and her dedication to the students. He talked about the service projects that the students participated in during camp & thanked the students for making such a huge impact on the local community. The students packed over 2000 meals during camp. Those meals were given to a community center in the Batesburg area.

Next year Jr High will take place June 5-8th with a "buffer day" between. Senior high will take place the 10-14th. Mike told a story of sitting and talking with Dennis Johnson and the new camp director. Dennis, with tears in his eyes, told Mike how important youth camp is to family camp. C. DISTRICT NMI CONVENTION

Monday Morning, July 25, 2011

The 69th Annual South Carolina District NMI Convention reconvened at Columbia First Church of the Nazarene at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, July 25, 2011.

Dennis Pinnell led the congregation in worship. Rev. Carey Pratt opened with prayer.

District NMI President LaNora Jensen welcomed everyone and made opening announcements. Children were invited to attend the children's activities with Rev. Karen Lawson.

President Jensen called the meeting to order and introduced District NMI Secretary Whitney Lyman, who made the motion to set the matters pertaining to the organization of the day 8:30 a.m. - 12 noon and established the seating and voting area for delegates. Motion was seconded and passed. Special order of the day was set at 9:15 a.m. By common consent, assisting the convention business will be: Diane Estep, recording secretary; Dr. Eddie Estep, parliamentarian; Bill Watts, Jason Leviner, and Jerry Branham, pages.

Pastors were given instructions for seating alternate delegates, and forms were distributed and collected. Secretary Lyman made the motion to seat the alternate delegates without reading the names, but that the names will be checked for accuracy; motion seconded and passed.

A video clip of greetings from General NMI Director Dr. Daniel Ketchum was shown. President Jensen read greetings from two of our missionaries. The Convention also received greetings from Rev. Jennifer Brown from the Caribbean Region and from our assigned LINKS missionaries.

Connie Hoover led the Convention delegates in filling out their order forms for their local NMI.

Dr. Eddie Estep assumed the chair for the Special Order of the Day. He presented District NMI President Jensen for her seventh report. She said the NMI has four objectives: Praying, Discipling, Giving, and Educating. President Jensen gave several illustrations about how the South Carolina District has fulfilled these objectives this past year. She thanked the many individuals who volunteered their time in leading the NMI ministries. President Jensen announced that the district

World Evangelism Fund has now reached the 109% mark. A motion was made and seconded to accept this report. Motion carried as unanimous.

President Jensen referred to several items located in the delegate's packet, including the Standard and Goals Report. Secretary Lyman made a motion to adopt the District NMI Standards and Goals Committee Report. Motion seconded. Motion passed and report adopted.

Sylvia Whiting gave a Memorial Roll presentation. She reported that the funds given for the Memorial Roll help provide health care support for Nazarene missionaries. Special music was presented by Chuck and Tina Morse while the names of those on the Memorial Roll were scrolled on the screen. Sylvia led in prayer.

President Jensen introduced our special speaker of the morning, Rev. Michael and Rev. Tamara Hudson. They both read from Psalm 62 and showed a slide tour of Romania and how God is at work. They said a very effective way of sharing Christ with people in Romania is personal evangelism.

The results of the district NMI Council ballot were read. The following were elected: (207 ballots cast) NMI Vice President – Carey Pratt; NMI Treasurer – Elizabeth Dunham; NMI Secretary – Whitney Lyman; NMI Council – Richard Coleman, Sylvia Whiting and Brian Walker.

President Jensen thanked individuals for their assistance during the Convention. Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the Convention after the children present the song that they learned during the morning. Motion passed.

Rev. Brian Walker closed the morning session in prayer for the district NMI Council.

Committee on Standards and Goals 2011-2012

We, your Committee on Standards and Goals, urge that each local NMI plan to meet all requirements for Mission Priority One, World Evangelism Church of Excellence, and the Exemplary Award. Standards and goals help to keep our priorities in the right perspective. Standards set rules for measuring, and goals keep us on the right course.

I. We recommend that each local NMI council meet promptly following the district convention and make plans to receive all awards: Mission Priority One, World Evangelism Church of Excellence, and Exemplary NMI by participating in all of the following:

1. **MISSION PRIORITY ONE.** That each local church meets the following four goals to become a Mission Priority One Church:

(1) **PRAYING**

- **Objective:** To encourage people to pray for leaders and churches and for the Holy Spirit to draw all people to Christ.
- **Requirement:** The church will pray for missions.
- **Helpful Ideas:**
 - Provide regular prayer requests to the church. Possible sources are Prayer Mobilization Line (call 913-577-2990 or via e-mail subscription or the NMI Web site www.nazarenemissions.org), missionaries' newsletters, personal contact with missionaries, etc. Disseminate through worship folders, handouts, pastoral prayer, announcements, church newsletters, etc.
 - Emphasize prayer and fasting.
 - Establish specific times for prayer and/or form a prayer chain/network.
 - Plan church wide participation in World Day of Prayer, Nazarene World Week of Prayer, and prayer for the Persecuted Church, 10/40 Window, and *JESUS* film.

(2) **DISCIPLING**

- **Objective:** Mentoring and involving all people, including children and youth, to make Christlike disciples in the nations.
- **Requirement:** The church will provide opportunities for the children and youth to experience missions and to respond to God's call.
- **Helpful Ideas:**
 - Use children's and youth mission's resource materials.
 - Plan for visiting missionaries to interact with children and youth.
 - Participate in Crisis Care Kits and School Pal-Paks projects.
 - Participate in Children's Mission Fair and Children's Mission Convention.
 - Enlist youth for summer ministries-local, district, and global levels.
 - Plan a commitment service for children/youth.
 - Encourage children and youth who sense God's call to missionary service to contact the local and district Mission Call Coordinator

(3) **GIVING**

- **Objective:** Devoting ourselves and our resources, including the World Evangelism Fund, to extend Christ's kingdom.
- **Requirement:** The church will give 5.5% of current income for World Evangelism Fund.
- **Helpful Ideas:**
 - Plan an effective faith promise event.
 - Promote Easter and Thanksgiving offerings.

(4) **EDUCATING**

- **Objective:** To inform people of the world's needs and enabling our church to meet those needs in Christ.
- **Requirement:** The church will participate in all four categories below:
 - a. Use multimedia mission resources and/or mission publications.
 - b. Promote NMI mission books/tapes, CDs.
 - c. Participate in mission service projects or activities
 - d. Attend a service with a missionary speaker or mission emphasis
- **Helpful Ideas:**

- Use Mission videos, Media Library, missions publications and communications.
 - Participate in missions service projects (such as Work & Witness, Youth mission trips,). Prepare Crisis Care Kits, School Pal-Paks, or LINKS packages.
2. **WORLD EVANGELISM CHURCH OF EXCELLENCE.** That each church give at least 5.7% (or overpay by \$1,500, whichever is less) to World Evangelism Fund to invest in new world areas and new works in the U.S.A. and Canada.
3. **EXEMPLARY AWARD.** That each church meet all the goals of Mission Priority One, Award of Excellence, plus meet all of the goals listed below to qualify for Exemplary Award:
- (1) **Pay District NMI Budget in full** by participating fully with the “Fair Share” Budget Payment Program. This will pay all District Budgets in full.
 - (2) **Participate in World Mission Broadcast (Radio)** by receiving an offering. There is no assigned goal set.
 - (3) **Participate in the District Work & Witness Program offering** by mailing a separate offering to the District NMI Treasurer. There is no assigned goal set.
 - (4) **Participate in the Missionary Health Care Plan** – by presenting a minimum of one or more of the following:
 - Memorial Roll Certificate for an adult or child
 - Distinguished Service Award
 - “Gifts from the Heart”
 - Receive an Offering for the Medical Plan.
 - (5) **Participate in an Alabaster Offering.** There is no goal set.
 - (6) **Support the LINKS** missionaries assigned solely to our district by promptly responding to the requests made for their specific needs, remembering their birthdays and anniversaries, and/or send a “cash” LINKS gift.
 - (7) **Give a Deputation offering for a visiting Nazarene Missionary.** Offerings may be given: at your church, or at the Children’s Mission Fair, and/or in another Church of the Nazarene deputation service.

It is recommended that each pastor and NMI president plan for and publicize the missionary deputation service scheduled by the District Deputation Coordinator. A healthy involvement in the total mission program, by both the local church and the district, is partially dependent on a yearly visit from a missionary. The missionary is the liaison with the world mission areas where the Church of the Nazarene is at work. At the deputation service, a deputation check written out to the General Treasurer Church of the Nazarene, should be given to the missionary. The missionary will mail this deputation check to Kansas City. Suggested deputation check amounts:
Sunday A.M. Service - \$400 to \$500 minimum
Sunday P.M. Service - \$250 to \$350 minimum
Weekday Service - \$225 to \$325 minimum
After the missionary speaks, a love offering is encouraged, in addition to the deputation check. This helps with the missionary's deputation tour expenses.

- (8) **Participate in the Compassionate Ministries Offering** and when possible be involved in a project or child sponsorship. There is no goal set.
 - (9) **Respond to specific District or General NMI** designated emergency needs as presented.
- II. An Exemplary Commendation will be given at the District NMI Convention to every pastor and NMI President of the churches that meet all the above goals qualifying them for the **Exemplary Award**.
 - III. We recommend that the local NMI council members, when possible, be considered as nominees for election as delegates to the district NMI convention.
 - IV. We recommend that local NMI presidents send their annual reports to the district NMI secretary to be received no later than the established deadline.
 - V. We recommend that each local NMI council be provided with a *Nazarene Missions International Handbook*, or copies of the member's particular responsibilities.
 - VI. We recommend that each local NMI council encourage and assist their pastor(s) with Work & Witness expenses.
 - VII. We recommend that each local NMI council encourage and assist lay person(s) with Work & Witness expenses.

VIII. That each church endeavor to meet all the requirements for the South Carolina District **Exemplary Award**.
